



Within that framework, he exhibited a flair for writing vivid vignettes, each showing a key professional or life lesson he learned from the experiences. You understand the warm dynamic between Gabriel and his parents as he reflected upon the delicate and sometimes messy interplay between parental guidance and self-actualization. At the writing's conclusion, Gabriel makes the reader feel a connection to him. That said, Gabriel seems intent on pursuing a career in tech and is excited to join Rhodes' Computer Science department. Additionally, he plans to try out for the orchestra or jazz band as a trumpeter.

Why did you choose Rhodes?

The close connections that are fostered here really resonated with me. I appreciate the culture of service here, and I wanted to be a part of such a great community.

When Yash co-founded the Collierville High School Samsung Solve for Tomorrow Club, he had a clear focus in mind. Yash says that he would like to work with the Biology and Physics departments at Rhodes to test the viability of such a machine in hopes of creating an effective solution.


What have been some highlights of your involvement with the Day Scholars Program?


